

CCNSG - Safety Passport



Overview

The CCNSG Safety Passport Programme provides essential training to all site personnel to ensure that they have a basic understanding and knowledge of health and safety.

The CCNSG Safety Passport Training Programme is monitored and controlled by a national steering group known as the Client/Contractor National Safety Group (CCNSG) who are there to ensure that standards are being maintained and that the content of the training programme continues to meet current safety legislation and current safety practices.

Aims

The aim of the CCNSG Safety Passport Scheme is to ensure a basic knowledge of health and safety for all site personnel to enable them, after appropriate site induction, to work on site more safely with lower risk to themselves and others.

The programme involves a significant amount of trainee participation. Most contractors' personnel know something about the topics before they arrive and lively discussions are often the order of the day. In presenting the course, the trainers talk with the trainees rather than at them, giving the continuous message "If you can't do it safely, don't do it".

There is an additional day for Supervisors, which emphasises the key role that Supervisors have in securing health and safety, including safety communications and risk assessments.

Trainers

All our trainers are Approved and Licensed by ECITB as trainers able to deliver the CCNSG Safety Passport courses.

Duration

14 hours delivered over 2 days.

Certification/Outcomes

Upon completion of the CCNSG course and module end tests, successful delegates will be awarded their CCNSG Safety Passport. This will remain current for 3 years from the date of issue and can be renewed through the CCNSG renewal course. This has to be taken within three months of the Safety Passport expiry date.
